# Key Observations in the Aerospace Supply Chain

- Production ramp up, post-COVID
- Long lead times for components
- Inflation
- Labour shortages; new hiring as well as retention
- Requirement for extra or open capacity for machining rushed parts/AOG
- Limited number of specialized suppliers
- Modernization of ERP systems
- Two-way customer supplier relationship



### DAIR Supplier Development Initiative

- Assist 16 Southern Ontario-based aerospace SMEs by assessing their capacities and determining requirements to better serve Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs) and other Tier 1 companies.
- DAIR aims to foster collaboration SMEs will be mentored through the program by one of their customers.
- Through the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario (FedDev Ontario), DAIR is providing financial support for the assessments as well as directly to the SMEs.

#### Supplier Development Initiative

#### Step 1: Capability Assessment

- SMEs will undergo a DAIR-NGen Canada assessment audit.
- DAIR will support the full cost of the assessment audit.

#### Step 2: Development of an Action Plan

Based on assessment results and with support from their mentors, the SME will determine an action plan with projects to be implemented.

#### **Step 3: Implementation of Projects**

- DAIR will support the implementation of those projects by the SMEs, up to 75% of total costs
  (to a maximum of \$37,500 per company in non-refundable support).
- Must be completed by January 2024.
